## November 2023

A memorable season of cricket has ended, with an extraordinary Test series which kept us all enthralled to the end. Our World Cup campaign in India has proved disappointing, rather overshadowed by the Rugby World Cup, which has provided some wonderful matches, with the second-tier nations stepping up and showing some great attacking rugby.

This is our second general catalogue of the year, with the two specialist catalogues on 18th century material coming in between. This catalogue has the same mix as usual, nearly all new stock. There are also a few duplicates from my collection of cricket fiction. I always enjoyed the stories of boy's batting so well at school that they got picked for England.

Some of the items in here come from the estate of Robin Brodhurst. In 2020, we published *The Altham-Bradman Letters*, based on the correspondence between Bradman and Robin's grandfather, Harry Altham. Robin died suddenly and unexpectedly earlier this year, and I went to his memorial service, held in the chapel at Pangbourne College, where Robin taught for some time. Stephen Chalke was one of the speakers, and it is hoped to publish a booklet with the speeches from the memorial service. From Robin's collection I would point out the letters between Altham and "Monty" - Field Marshall Bernard Montgomery (Item 373).

Another collection acquired recently is that of Ken Watkin, who died in the summer. He was a French teacher but a passionate Yorkshireman. The last time I saw him was at a book fair where he was wearing a t-shirt with a head and shoulders portrait of Lord Hawke on the front. He was of course particularly keen on Yorkshire, but also built up a very good collection of tour brochures, many of which he had rebound. Some appear in this catalogue (for example Items 197, 199, 207 and 212).

Bath Christmas Market will be in full swing in the centre of the city, so it sounds like it could be a good day out for all the family!



## References

We give bibliographical references where we can, such as Padwick 4321. Padwick compiled the main bibliography of all cricket books and brochures, published in 1977, but we usually quote from the expanded second edition, published in 1984. This covers all cricket books published up to 1979. Volume II, by Ely and Griffiths, fills in a few gaps and lists all titles published between 1980 and 1989.

We also quote specialist bibliographies - “Franks” is the New Zealand Bibliography and “Baloch” is the Pakistan bibliography.

We published both of these, and have copies available for sale at **£30 each or the two for £50 (post free in UK)**





## New Books

**SOMERSET CRICKETERS REVISITED: New Discoveries** by Barry Phillips. Leisuresolve Publishers, Oxford 2022. Hardback in dustjacket. **Copies available signed by the author on the title-page at £22 + £5 p&p (UK)**

Between 2016 and 2021, Stephen Hill and Barry Phillips produced five volumes on Somerset Cricketers, which contained biographies and photographs of the 664 men who had appeared for the county between 1876 and 2000. This sixth volume includes a wealth of newly discovered information, with seventy refreshed and expanded biographies, as well as more than 100 previously unpublished images.



**FOOTPRINTS: David Foot's Lifetime of Writing** by Stephen Chalke. Published in 2023 by Charlecombe Books, Bath in association with Fairfield Books. Hardback in dustjacket. 384 pages. **Copies available signed by the author at £22 + £5 p&p (UK)**

David Foot was an eminent and well-loved West Country journalist and author, who died in 2021 at the grand old age of 92. Stephen Chalke has produced a mammoth book, showcasing the best of David Foot's writing, not just on cricket, but football, theatre and much else.



### Early Children's Book with Cricket Illustration




1. **BASSAM, Robert.** THE ENTERTAINING HISTORY OF FRANCIS FAIRPLAY. (R. Bassam London) c1800. 12mo c4 x2½ inches, pp32 including faded Dutch paper wrappers. Very worn, with rear one detached, corners turned, and **lacking 2 leaves, pages 3/4 (title-page) and 29/30.** **£1,200.00** This moral tale includes Francis playing at cricket. On page 8 he is shown about to bowl underarm, with text above: "Playing at cricket was his favourite exercise, here he is with the ball in his hand, looking as earnestly at his play as he does at his book." The words FAIRPLAY and CRICKET are printed in capitals, suggesting that the concept of fairplay is as important in sport as it is in all aspects of life.

*This is very rare, the only known complete copy being in the Osborne Collection of children's books in Toronto.*


### The first supplement

2. **BENTLEY, Henry.** AN ACCOUNT OF THE PRINCIPAL CRICKET MATCHES, PLAYED IN THE YEAR 1823. WITH THE PARTICULARS OF EACH INNINGS. H.Bentley, 12 Grove Street, Lisson Grove. Printed by T.Traveller, 43, Park Street, New Road 1823. 8vo, pp(18). In paper covers, with facsimile title-page. **£750.00** Padwick 1221. Only Britcher and Epps preceded Bentley in listing important matches. If it had not been for these three pioneers, records of many matches would have been irretrievably lost when the Lord's pavilion burnt down in 1825. Modern researchers have pored over these books and found discrepancies in dates, but more remains to be done to build up a complete picture of the players and the matches in the early years of this great game. Bentley was intimately concerned with cricket as a player and umpire, and lived very close to Lord's. His first volume came out in 1823, listing matches up to the end of 1822. This is the first supplement, considerably scarcer than the original book. It covers matches in 1823. There was a second supplement with matches played in 1824 and 1825, and that is also scarce.





*Following on from "My Dear Michael" (2007) this is a new collection of letters and articles by Neville Cardus from The Neville Cardus Archive developed by the Lancashire County Cricket Club Library at Old Trafford. It covers a wide range of topics, including music, cricket, professional concerns and personal matters, as well as Cardus's experiences at Shrewsbury School and in Australia. The book comprises over 80 letters, mostly with lively replies from recipients such as "Guardian" editors, friends of Cardus's youth, and fellow Mancunian and music critic Michael Kennedy, together with a detailed commentary, explanatory footnotes and many illustrations. Issued in an edition limited to 500 numbered copies. This is No.173.*

*Padwick 1183. This is the first volume in the new series of a periodical which ran from 1882 to 1913. It contains a record of the game at all levels, from international matches to club matches. This volume contains a full report on the triangular Test series involving England, Australia and South Africa.*

*Padwick 1195. A very good set of this important periodical, which printed much original research. It also contains the frankest book reviews I have ever read, and was presided over by one of the strangest men ever to write on cricket. His background is shrouded in mystery, although some people speak of MI6. What is known is that he became convinced that he could, by concentrating his mind, control pain in his body, and he attempted to cut his own leg off without anaesthetic. The attempt failed, but the leg had to be amputated.*



*There are two interesting references to cricket in this book. Page 48 is on Dartford Brent, where it has a piece on the battles and tournaments of previous years, leading to: "the tournaments now exhibited upon this ground are of a more amicable kind. Lords, knights and esquires indeed enter the list, but the lance is exchanged for the bat: the dexterous and powerful use of which instrument, and for expertly handling the ball, the inhabitants of this county have always been famous, and generally victorious. But to affirm, that at the manly game of cricket, even the men of Kent were never conquered, would be paying them a compliment at the expence of truth." Page 246 describes Bourne Place, "the seat of Sir Horatio Mann". "Since the game of cricket has been patronised by several of our nobility and gentry, in this paddock many great matches have been decided, between the greatest heroes of the Bat this age, or perhaps any other, ever produced." Horatio Mann, usually known as Horace Mann, was an avid cricket supporter, and was one of the group that gathered at the Star and Garter in February 1774 to settle on the definitive laws of cricket.*

*Padwick 1060. The first of only two years issued.*

11. **DIPPER, Alfred Ernest. CRICKET HINTS.** *Athletic Publications (c1926).* 12mo, pp80. 6 photographs. Card covers. A good copy. **£25.00**  
*Padwick 500. Mostly instructional, but starting with a short review of his career. A stalwart for Gloucestershire for over 20 years he only played one Test for England, in 1921. Apparently his fielding was not good enough.*





*Padwick II 0466. This is an investigation into the three Lord's grounds, together with prefatory material on cricket in the 18th century, early cricket grounds such as the Artillery Ground, and cricket playing Dukes, such as the Duke of Dorset. It includes a reproduction of part of the 1790s map by Richard Horwood which shows the first Lord's ground. It is nice to see that then there was a nursery next door so you could bowl from the nursery end in 1795!*

*In 2006, David Rayvern Allen produced a booklet which pinned down the precise site of the second Lord's ground. We still have copies of this available at £5.00.*


*Padwick 1088. It is possible that a limited number of copies were produced like this each year, but I have not seen similar copies for all years.*

Many illustrations in black & white and colour. Bound in imitation green leather with gilt lettering to front and spine and a pictorial montage of Bradman laid down to a panel on the front. A good copy. Large price sticker on back. **£20.00**

*A collection of paintings and drawings of Bradman, by artist Brian Clinton, that hang in The Bradman Museum in Bowral. They are accompanied by text from Museum Director, Richard Mulvaney.*

18. **(NEW SPORTING MAGAZINE, The).** FIVE VOLUMES COMPRISING VOLS.I TO V. MAY 1831-OCTOBER 1833. *London 1831-1833.* The first five volumes of the New Sporting Magazine. Each volume contains six months. Each has twelve plates. Each month has a contents page and there is an index to each volume. Uniformly bound in full-tan morocco, gilt boxes on spine, red leather labels. All edges gilt. Green silk bookmark in each volume. A handsome run. **£600.00**

*Padwick 1057. All, except volume II, have cricket references. Some have scorecards of matches and volume V has a review of Nyren's Young Cricketers Guide. September 1833 also has a three page cricket poem, "A Cricket Match", by "A Single Dorset".*

*The main cricket interest in this run is in the Cricketers Register, bound in at the end of volume V. It is not mentioned in Taylor, Goldman or Gaston. Padwick and other cricket bibliographers had only seen this as a separate unbound publication, and it is only recently that we have*

*realised that it was an integral part of the 'New Sporting Magazine'. Padwick lists it as No. XXVIII Vol. V. This does appear at the foot of page 1, but the numbering then changes at the foot of page 9 to No. XXIX Vol. V., and at the foot of page 17 to No. XXX Vol. V.*


*A piece at the end of the July issue stated that "We have arranged with a gentleman to supply a return of all the cricket Matches, which will be published separately (eight pages at a time) the same as our coursing calendar. The first eight pages will be given next month."*

*The title-page for No 28 August 1833 contains a listing for the Cricketers Register as Page 1, after the main pagination of the issue and the Racing Calendar. Nos.29 and 30 are similar (No.29 page 9, No.30 page 17).*


*The changes in numbering at the foot of the page do not equate with a change in month. The register describes matches through the season from June to September, with the date and day noted. A short paragraph at the beginning says "The season commenced early in April by a match .... etc". It finishes with the scorecard for England v Sussex on September 17. This scorecard has slight differences from that given in Scores And Biographies and Bells Life. Below it is a Note.- "Our readers will find an account of the former match in our last number, page 362". (This is the September issue).*

*David Rayvern Allen, in "Early Books on Cricket" states that "The Register was published in a series of monthly instalments covering the whole season from April to September." We can now see that it was published in only three instalments, from August to October. It would appear that as all the calendars were separately paginated from the main sequence it was intended that subscribers would collect them throughout the season and bind them together at the end of the main sequence.*

*There was not to be another Cricketers Register in following years. The main thrust of "The New Sporting Magazine" is hunting, shooting, fishing, coursing etc, and it may be that subscribers were not interested enough in cricket. It may be that the scarcity of the register today can be explained by the subscribers discarding the cricket section as not fitting in with their country pursuits, and not worth binding in. There is certainly no indication of a register in 1834.*

The Game will commence precisely at nine o'clock in order to prevent disappointment, pursuant to an agreement signed by each party.

Mrs. HOPPER begs to inform her Friends that DINNER will be on Table at the Park Gate, at Two o'Clock.

*A fascinating collection. Cricket in the 19th century was spreading its wings, and the reports in these newspapers show its growing popularity across the country and overseas. The collection starts with 27 copies of the "English Chronicle" published between May 13th and September 30th of 1802. The first reports a match between Eleven Gentlemen of Woolwich and Eleven Gentlemen of Bromley, for 500 guineas. Most of the reports in 1802 are about clubs in London and its suburbs, but there are some from*

*Brighton, where the Prince of Wales patronised the cricket. Lord Frederick Beauclerk features in several reports, playing for teams including the Eleven of England. The Prince of Wales appears again in 1804, where a report in the "London Chronicle" of September 11th has the Prince bowling: "His Royal Highness partook of the pleasures of the game for some considerable time. An accident at length, in bowling, unfortunately impelled him to discontinue play."*

*"The Morning Post" of July 31st, 1807, has the scorecard of a match at Cheltenham, between "gentlemen visitors", and the "Norfolk Chronicle" of July 15th 1809 gives us reports of some village matches.*

*There is a good batch of copies from 1825 of "Pierce Egan's Life in London", which reports on several days the match between All England and 22 of Sheffield at Darnall. In this year there are more reports of matches outside London, including: at Canterbury, where the players were "maimed and otherwise disfigured" by a hailstorm; at High Wycombe, where the Eton players ripped up the wickets when one was given out; at Teignbridge, "It is highly pleasing to find the noble, manly game of cricket making such progress in the West of England".*

*1831 brings a lengthy report in the "Norfolk Chronicle" on what the season will bring for the Norwich Club. "The Norwich Ground now possesses in Fuller and William Pilch two first-rate men; and it is with pleasure we see the acquisition of such a cricketer as Fuller Pilch attached to our ground."*


*“The Maidstone Journal” of 1832 has reports on various matches, and has an attractive woodcut of a match, often seen in Kent newspapers.*

*“Chambers Edinburgh Journal” of 1832 has a lengthy piece with instructions on fielding positions, and “Bells Weekly Messenger” of 1833 reports on a law case about betting on a match between Warwick and Birmingham.*

*1844 sees the first overseas newspaper in this collection, the “Public Ledger” of Philadelphia, which reports on the match between the Union Club of Philadelphia and the Union Star Club of Brooklyn.*

*“Bell’s Life” in 1854 shows that cricket has reached the stage where it is possible to make money from it, with advertisements for cricketing goods, and the Wolverhampton club wishing to employ a professional.*

*“The New York Times” of September 1859 reports the match between the England Eleven and 22 of Canada, on the first overseas tour of an English side. There are two other newspapers reporting this tour, with “Harper’s Weekly” (New York) having an article on “The Cricket Mania”.*



*“The Illustrated Sporting and Dramatic News” of 1882 reports on the Australian tourists, with the issue for October 7th having a large illustration of scenes from the banquet given to the tourists.*

*There are several copies of “The Times” from 1888, reporting on the Australian tourists, and the collection ends with a copy of “Harper’s Weekly” from September 1894, which has a short, inaccurate, history of cricket in America.*

This side has always been known as Tarrant’s team, although former Australian captain Jack Ryder was the on-the-field leader. The team was made up of famous veterans, some of whom came out of retirement for the trip, and promising youngsters. Twenty three matches were played on the tour (the Australians winning 11, drawing 9 and losing 3); four of these were against fully representative Indian teams, with the Australians winning the first two and the Indians the last two. Jack Ryder was the most successful batsman on the tour with 1121 runs at 48.74, and Ron Oxenham the most successful bowler with 101 wickets at 8.19 apiece.*



**Rickard Mark ELLIOTT (West)**  
Born Ashford, 21 September, 1959. A right-arm medium fast bowler and left-handed batsman, Rickard Elliott made his Test debut in 1984 when he played in the first match against Australia at Trent Bridge. He returned home in 1984-85, but he was not selected for the series against Australia last season nor the Fifth Test, at Edgbaston, when he took 6 for 77 in the first innings. He finished the season with 10 wickets for 165 runs in 2 Tests. A left-handed batsman, he had against Sri Lanka at Lord's in 1984 complete his bowling Test maiden. A graduate of Exeter University where he studied civil engineering, Elliott made his first-class debut in 1981 and has since played two years longer. He is now more than 2000 miles from his birthplace as a first-class wicket-keeper.

*Test Record:* Tests 11; Innings 20; Overs 425.1; Runs 362; H.S. 41; Average 13.46; 13 wickets at 43.76 runs apiece, Best 6/77.

**John Ernest EMBUREY (Middlesex)**  
Born Pexham, 20 August, 1952. One of the leading off-break bowlers in world cricket and a batsman who has now scored more than 5500 runs and four Test centuries, John Emburey made his debut in a triumphant return to international cricket last summer, taking 19 wickets in the Cornhill Test series against England. He followed this with 14 wickets in the West Indies where he was England's leading bowler. He made his debut for Middlesex in 1973 and takes his benefit this season. His Test debut came against New Zealand at Lord's in 1978 and his best bowling performance was in the inaugural Test match against Sri Lanka in Colombo in 1982 when his off-spin turned the match in England's favour after Sri Lanka had seemingly taken a winning position. His one Test fifty came against Australia at Old Trafford, 1981. His ability with the ball was well shown when he was playing for Western Province in the Currie Cup, 1983-84, for 13 matches against Basutaland Province he hit six fifties in 10 balls and reached 52 net off 22 deliveries.

**Bruce Nicholas FRENCH (Nottinghamshire)**  
Born Walsby, 13 August, 1959. Bruce French was reserve wicket-keeper until the tour to India, 1984-85, and in the West Indies earlier this year. On both of those tours, his neat, unadorned and efficient style and his contribution to the general team spirit won him the highest praise. He now finds himself called into the England side for Test matches for the first time although he did keep wicket in the Four Nations Limited-Overs Tournament in Sharjah, 1985. He was the leading wicket-keeper in 1984 when he had 18 dismissals, and he has already done so before this season. He is a competent batsman able to adapt his game to the needs of the side, and he has scored nearly 4,000 runs since his debut in 1976 when he was only 10 years 287 days. His batting form apart, from cricket it took circulating all aspects of modern coaching.

**Graham Alan GOUCH (Rose)**  
Born Leightonston, 23 July, 1957. Few players have had a more honourable debut in Test cricket than Graham Gouch. It was brought in to the freedom-loving Australian side by Allan Border, who like Lillie and Thompson were in their prime and were capable of wicket for 0 in both periods. He has since been quite relaxed about the fact that his debut was in the First Test but says his 165, which was the highest of his Test centuries. He began his first-class career in 1973, was capped in 1975 and took a record benefit last season. He succeeded Keith Fletcher as captain of Leamington at the beginning of this season. An immensely powerful right-handed opening batsman and a modern pace bowler, good enough to jump Vasekar and take 5 for 100 in his first Test, Gouch visited South Africa in 1984 and 1985. Chappell named him Test victim. Speed equalled to English records in 1984 when he scored 2539 runs in 14 Tests in one averaging 2000 runs in first-class cricket. A major test batsman, he has become a specialist slip although he does not always opt for this position for England. His first century came at 41 years, 10 months and runs with West Indies. Added to the world record he held jointly with Trevor at Lord's, 1984, he has the most runs in the first-innings Test.

**David Iwan GOWER (Leicestershire)**  
Born Tateside Works, Now, 1 April, 1957. David Gower gave up reading Law at London University in order to concentrate on his cricket career, a decision for which critics of the game have been grateful. His Test played for Leicestershire in 1975, was capped in 1977 and made his Test debut the following year. The match was against Pakistan at Edgbaston and he scored 58, hitting the first ball he received, from Laigbt Ali, for four. The first of his twelve Test hundreds came later the same season, against New Zealand at The Oval. Last season he reached the heights of his Test career, scoring 322 runs in the Corquett Test series against Australia in which he included an innings of 215, his highest in first-class cricket, at Edgbaston. He shared in stands of over 300 in Leeds and 2nd Tests, one with Robinson and one with Clough. However, again in 1984, his leading run-scorer when he boy, Ian Botham, came back earlier this year. He succeeded Bob Willis as England's number one in 1984 when England were heavily beaten by the West Indians, but he led England to triumph in India and to victory over Afghanistan in the Ashes series last summer before falling heavily again to the West Indies.

**Allan Joseph LAMB (Northamptonshire)**  
Born Langenhawing, South Africa, 20 June, 1954. Allan Lamb, an attacking right-handed batsman and excellent fielder, began his first-class career in South Africa, playing for Western Province in the Currie cup from 1972 to 1983. He qualified for Northamptonshire in 1983 and made his Test debut against Australia in 1982. He was the lowly 10th Devon & Cornwall player to play in a Test match, having been second. As Alid Trafford, he again fell for 3 in the first Test but he the first of his 7 Test centuries. Four of his Test hundreds came in the summer of 1984 when he took three centuries in 7 Tests and 1000 runs, but his highest score was made against New Zealand at Nottingham in 1983. A great cut of runner, he is not a regular bowler with his medium pace, but he has taken 100 other wickets when England were in India in 1984. He has scored 17000 runs in first-class cricket.

**MANNAR SINGH, Haridwarwala (Bhili)**  
Born Pune, 12 June, 1965. A slow left-arm bowler and right-handed batsman, Mannar Singh took 39 wickets in the Indian season that finished in April, one of only two bowlers to post 100 wickets. He played a vital part in Delhi's Ranji Trophy triumph, with 34 wickets in the competition, and in the final took 3 for 66 and 8 for 40. At Hariana were beaten by an innings. When he made his Test debut against Pakistan at Karachi, December, 1982, he was 17 years, 193 days old, and at that time he was the youngest ever Indian to represent India in a Test match. He failed to take a wicket in his first Test and dismissed Bhanu Khan in a personal score of 101 runs as Pakistan reached 62-0 in his second Test. He made good use of his pace in the next year and now appears to be the most consistent bowler to the great Blenheim Bowl. He showed good form in the 1984-85 season, last year, returning his best figures in the third Test of 5 for 40. He returned 2 for 46 in the first Test of 1985-86, but was off colour in his second innings in the First Test at Adelaide. **Test Record:** Tests 16, Inns 19, Not Out 6, Runs 47, H.S. 15, Average 66.99; 9 wickets at 26.66 runs apiece, Best 4/83.

**MORF, Kiroo Shankar (Bhudi)**  
Born Baroda, 4 September, 1962. Kiroo Morf toured West Indies as Kirmari's deputy in 1982-83, but was overlooked when Kirmari was left out of the side for the World Championship of Cricket in Australia for the Asia Cup in Sharjah, and for the Test series in Sri Lanka. On those occasions the selectors turned to Saldadam Yashwanth. Morf was named in deputy wicket-keeper for the tour to Australia, however, and took over from Kirmari during the Benson and Hedges World Series. His first-class debut came in 1980-81 and he last made 100 divisions in his credit, more than a quarter of them stumped. He figured in a record last wicket stand for the Ranji Trophy of 143 with V. Padi against the Central Indians in 1983. More scored 181 not out, the highest, of his two first-class hundreds. In recent months his batting has declined somewhat, but he is a most accomplished wicket-keeper who is a valuable asset to his side as a batsman. His international cricket was restricted to limited-over matches until he made his Test debut at Lord's. **Test Record:** Tests 1, Inns 1, Not Out 0, Runs 23, H.S. 23, Average 23.00.

**PANDIT, Chandrakant Sitaram (Bombay)**  
Born Bombay, 30 September, 1961. A forceful right-handed batsman and highly efficient wicket-keeper, Pandit took Ziddique Parkar's Ranji Trophy record when he caught 28 and stumped 3 batsmen in the 1983-84 season. Last season, not only did he account for 18 batsmen and finish third in the wicket-keepers' list, but he hit 570 runs, average 50.0, and finished top of the Indian first-class batting averages. He hit centuries in the Jharkhand Cup match and against Maharashtra, the first century came in the last-fifth of his Ranji Trophy year, although Bombay were surprisingly beaten, he scored 57 and 99 not out in an effort to save his skin. Such form could not be overlooked by the Indian selectors, and he was chosen to tour to England ahead of Viswanath and Khanna who had been in the reckoning as Kirmari's precursors. He made his two national debuts in the Australia Cup in Sharjah, but he may yet to play Test cricket. He made his first-class debut in the 1979-80 season.

**PATIL, Sandeep Madhusudan (Bombay)**  
Born Bombay, 18 August, 1956. Few will forget Sandeep Patil's career in the Old Trafford Test of 1982 when he moved from 72 to 100 in 10 balls and hit Bob Willis for 24 in one over which included a two-ball. He made his Test debut at Madras in January, 1980, against Pakistan, and the first of his first Test centuries came a year later when he hit 174 against Australia at Adelaide. As well as being an aggressive and enterprising right-handed batsman he is a medium pace bowler with considerable success in the Indian domestic scene. He took 18 wickets at 19.91 runs each and returned a career best 6 for 20 against Gujarat. Patil made his first-class debut in the 1975-76 and in the past decade he has displayed a variety of talents, as film star, editor of a weekly paper and business man. He was centred from the side that toured Australia a few months ago, but his record is not unimpressive for his first all-around season when he scored 381 runs, average 54.73, as well as the bowling successes mentioned above. **Test Record:** Tests 29, Inns 47, Not Out 4, Runs 1258, H.S. 174, Average 36.93; 9 wickets at 26.66 runs apiece, Best 6/20.

**PRAASHAKAR, Manoj (Delhi)**  
Born Ghazipur, 15 April, 1963. A right-arm medium pace bowler and right handed batsman, Praashakar is a good enough all-rounder to have opened both the batting and bowling for Delhi. He took 5 for 88 on his first-class debut against Hariana, 1982-83, and the following season he hit 122 in the Ranji Trophy against Bombay. Chosen to tour Zimbabwe with the Young India side in 1984, he made his Test debut against England later the same year. Raju Kukarni was preferred for the tour of Australia at the end of last year, but Praashakar's form in the Ranji Trophy was such that he could not be denied a place in the party to come to England. He hit three centuries in the Ranji Trophy including 153 in the final against Hariana, and finished the season with 502 runs, average 71.21. He also took 20 wickets for 321 runs to confirm his position as a top all-rounder. His early form in England has shown that he is particularly useful on our conditions. **Test Record:** Tests 2, Inns 4, Not Out 1, Runs 86, H.S. 35 not out, Average 38.66; 1 wicket for 102 runs, Best 1/88.


**SHARMA, Chetan Jagdish (Hariana)**  
Born Ludhiana, 3 January, 1960. Having been named best schoolboy cricketer of the year by the Indian Board of Control in 1981-82, Chetan Sharma made his Test debut in the first Test of 1982-83 against his Test debut in Pakistan in 1984-83. He took a wicket with his fifth ball in Test cricket when he bowled Mohsin Khan. He played against England and was outstanding. He hit 100 in Sri Lanka last year, capturing 17 wickets in 11 Tests. Coached by Desh Prem Arora who gave Karfi Doo to play cricket, Chetan Sharma is a fast bowler with medium length and rapidly improving right handed batted batsman. His pace and control have made him a considerable asset to his side in the Ranji Trophy and he has been a valuable member of the team in the Benson and Hedges World Series without hat and ball. India look upon him as the nation's most promising fast bowler and hope that this will be the series in which he establishes himself in the top flight of international all-rounders. He bowled with great set in the First Central Test at Lord's to claim 6 English wickets. **Test Record:** Tests 11, Inns 13, Not Out 6, Runs 175, H.S. 54, Average 25.00; 28 wickets at 37.78 runs apiece, Best 5/64.





He also played in 40 List A matches, including 2 One Day Internationals (1980/81). Taslim was a surprise signing for the second season of 'World Series Cricket' being uncapped at that time and virtually unknown outside of Pakistan. He made his Test debut (as a batsman) against India at Kolkata in January 1980, scoring 90 and 46, and in his third Test, against Australia at Faisalabad the same winter, made 210 not out, then the highest score by a wicket-keeper. Later that year he fractured a finger after being hit by Sylvester Clarke in the first Test against West Indies at Lahore. Despite a compound fracture of his finger he played in the next Test at Faisalabad, but following a moderate display with both bat and gloves was dropped for the final two Tests and never appeared for Pakistan again. He ended his Test career of 6 matches with a batting average of 62.62. He later became a popular television and radio commentator and also ran a cricket academy. Taslim died in 2008, aged 53, from a lung infection.*

## Cricket and War

373. (ALTHAM, Harry Surtees, and MONTGOMERY, Bernard Law, Viscount Montgomery of Alamein). LETTERS BETWEEN ALTHAM AND MONTGOMERY, MARCH TO MAY 1956. THREE LETTERS FROM MONTGOMERY, ONE TYPED, TWO HANDWRITTEN, AND A COPY LETTER FROM ALTHAM. **Including VAT £1,500.00**

*In 1956 Montgomery was asked to attend and speak at the M.C.C. Dinner. He wrote to Harry Altham for advice.*

**Letter One:** Dated 9 March 1956, from Montgomery's address, Isington Mill in Alton, headed "Allied Powers Europe Deputy Supreme Commander". It is two pages, typed **with signature (Montgomery of Alamein) in ink** and an ink PS - "I am to propose the toast of the M.C.C. Committee." He writes "I would like to say something helpful and constructive and it has occurred to me that I could speak on the similarity between war and cricket. There are certain guiding rules for the successful conduct of war; when these are neglected, you fail. It is the same in cricket. When I had to restore the fallen fortunes of the Eighth Army in August 1942, I concentrated first on : Leadership, Discipline, Training."



**Letter Two - Altham's Reply:** A five page typed letter, here as a copy. "having written in the M.C.C. Coaching Book that "cricket is warfare in miniature", I would be the last person to question your analogy." He writes paragraphs on leadership, discipline and training, and goes on to write about the first-class game, coming up with a surprising idea; "we want to get the amateur back into the game." To make this work Altham suggests "This can only be done by playing County Matches on Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays in May, June and July, and then reverting to the existing timetable for a "holiday" August. This would mean a reduction in the number of County matches, either by eliminating some Counties from the Championship or by an alternating yearly roster of "who plays who."

**Letter Three:** Montgomery replies with a handwritten letter in blue ink, dated April 1st 1956, on headed paper of the Trianon Palace Hotel, Versailles, thanking Altham for "your most excellent notes. I can now compile a good speech". Signed "Yrs sincerely Montgomery of Alamein."

**Letter Four:** Another handwritten letter in blue ink, dated 6th May 1956, from Isington Mill; "My dear Altham, you may like to have enclosed copy of what I said at Lord's on the 2nd May. It was, of course, all your stuff: spoken by me. I hope it may do some good." Signed "yrs sincerely Montgomery of Alamein."





*The duplicated copy of the speech (seven pages) is laid out after the pattern of Altham's letter, with sections on leadership, discipline and training, and a passage on bringing the amateur back into the game. Some of the passages are taken directly, word for word, from Altham's letter to Montgomery.*

These letters had been inherited by Robin Brodhurst, Altham's grandson, and he has transcribed them, and added notes on the people mentioned in the letters.






This was the famous match where England, set only 85 to win, fell short, largely due to 7 for 44 from "the demon" Spofforth. A spoof obituary for English cricket in a newspaper after the match gave us "The Ashes".



387. (PELLEW, Clarence Everard). A SHORT HANDWRITTEN NOTE (UNDATED). On pink paper. From an address in Walkerville, South Australia. Signed, a little shakily in later life, "C.E.Pellew". Including VAT £50.00 "Nip" Pellew (1893-1981) played in 91 first-class matches, including 10 Tests for Australia (1920/21-1921/22), scoring 4,536 runs at 33.60. In this short note, Pellew has written: "Excuse writing, but my wife and I have been ill and late in writing replies to letters. My birthday was Sept

23rd 1893. (Cricket Archive has his birthdate as September 21st). My brother L.V, who died several years ago, was six years younger than I. Good fortune and good health C.E.Pellew." L.V.Pellew died in 1970. He has also signed, a little shakily, on the back.

388. (ROSENWATER, Irving and BOWEN, Roland). A SERIES OF LETTERS BETWEEN IRVING ROSENWATER (3 copy letters) AND ROWLAND BOWEN (two letters) about Albert Kinross. Including VAT £35.00

The letters discuss the real name of Albert Kinross, a journalist who wrote "The Unconventional Cricketer". IR had discovered that his real name was Albert Elkin Rosenbaum. As Kinross, he played no first-class cricket but was a regular player for the Authors team, with others such as Conan Doyle and J.C.Snaith.



3. Letter from the Clerk of Accounts at Christ Church. IR had written an article about the hit for "The Cricketer", and the Clerk asks for Irving's source, as a college history says the hit was made in a first-class match. Dated 27th November 1959.
4. Copy letter from IR to the Clerk, stating that the college history is wrong, and the hit was made in practice, off the bowling of Charles Rogers, the grandfather of the Hampshire cricketer Neville Rogers. Dated 3rd December 1959.

Sadiq Mohammad (b.1945) played 387 first-class matches, including 1 match for Essex (1970), 193 for Gloucestershire (1972-82) and 41 Tests for Pakistan (1969/70-1980/1), scoring 24,160 runs at 37.51, with 50 centuries. He also played in 208 List A matches, including 19 One Day Internationals (1972/73-1980/81), scoring almost 6,000 runs. In this letter he is asking Lillee to provide an article for his benefit brochure.



## Captain of first team to Australia

391. (STEPHENSON, Heathfield Harman). A HANDWRITTEN LETTER DATED JULY 13, 1896, TO DAFT. Written from an address in Uppingham. Corners cut off, centre fold. Signed in ink "H.H.Stephenson". Including VAT £1,500.00

*H.H.Stephenson (1833-1896) played first-class cricket from 1853 to 1871, 256 matches in all, the majority for Surrey, but with some for All England, the Players, the South and so on. He was a decent all-rounder, taking 303 wickets at 16.30, scoring 7360 runs at 17.90 and catching 152 behind the wicket. He had been to America with the 1859 team, and captained the first team to tour Australia, in 1861-62, but retired before any international matches were designated as Tests. The remainder of his life was spent coaching at Uppingham School.*




In this letter he is writing about arrangements for a match against Haverford college: "Dear Daft, Thank you for your prompt reply to my letter. Our match with the Americans is only one day and the match to begin at ten o'clock on Wednesday. Will you therefore ask the Umpires to come to Manton by the first train on Wednesday. They can come from Manton to Uppingham by bus. I am faithfully yours H.H.Stephenson."


Preserved in an envelope with notes on Stephenson by Irving Rosenwater. IR had written the short piece on Stephenson in "The World of Cricket", and was conscious that Stephenson had not had the praise he deserved for his captaincy of the first tour to Australia. "He was in every respect an admirable choice as Captain - a talented all-round player, a professional to command the respect of his fellow professionals, a cricketer with experience of overseas touring, and an educated man."

IR also writes on Stephenson's appointment as an Umpire in the first Test in England in 1880. "His appointment, by the Surrey club, to stand in the Oval Test of 1880, must now be looked upon as something of a surprise and a curiosity, for I believe it is correct to say that Stephenson did not umpire in any first-class match that year. He was certainly not on the umpires' list." Also here is a photocopy of the scroll given to the team by the Melbourne CC. "We are requested by the members of the Melbourne Cricket Club to hand you the accompanying purse of one hundred sovereigns and in doing so to express their sense of your uniform manly conduct as Cricketers both in and out of the field during your stay in this Colony."

*Roy Tattersall (1922-2011) played 328 matches, including 277 for Lancashire (1948-60) and 16 Tests for England (1950/1 to 1954), taking 1,369 wickets at 18.03. In this letter he accepts an invitation to speak to the Wombwell Cricket Lovers Society.*



393. **(TAYLOR, William Thomas).** A HANDWRITTEN LETTER, DATED JULY 1 1923, TO F.E.LACEY. On the headed notepaper of Derbyshire County Cricket Club. Hole-punched at left. Signed nicely in ink "Yrs faithfully W.T.Taylor Sec." Including VAT £50.00  
*William Taylor (1885-1976) played four times for Derbyshire between 1905 and 1910, and was then Secretary to the County Club for over 50 years. In this letter to the Secretary of MCC he asks if the hours of play for the Northants v Derbyshire match could be changed to allow stumps to be drawn early on the last day, so that the teams could catch the last train from Chesterfield to London.*



*death in 1933 was General Manager of the Club. This letter is enquiring about lunching ladies who he will be bringing to the Varsity match.*

395. (TURNER, Montague). A THREE-PAGE HANDWRITTEN LETTER, UNDATED, (TO ALFRED GASTON). Written from Lindfield. Some marks on rear where it has been removed from an album. Some spotting. **Signed in ink "Yours very truly Montague Turner."** Including VAT £175.00

Montague Turner (1843-1908) was a wicket-keeper who played 53 first-class matches, including 29 for Middlesex (1863-1878), claiming 143 dismissals (79 caught and 64 stumped). His other first-class cricket matches were for the Gentlemen and clubs such as M.C.C. and Free Foresters. In this letter he is replying to a query from Gaston about cricket guides. Gaston often wrote to old cricketers asking if they had material to sell. Turner was probably not much use, as he says he has mislaid any guides he might have had and he never kept a scrapbook, but he does relate an odd story about the Gents v Players match of 1891 with Mr Appleby nearly drowning.

A short letter to an autograph collector.

## Albert Wilkes & Son, West Bromwich

Started in 1910 by Albert Wilkes, the former Aston Villa and England footballer, this West Bromwich firm produced good quality cricket (and football) photographs and postcards up until the late 1960s.

The following are all postcard-sized photographs with plain backs (unless where stated) and stamped with the Wilkes name and address, and often the player's name and a date. These photographic cards are increasingly hard to acquire and highly desirable.




*Ian Bedford (1930-1966) was a leg-break and googly bowler who played 77 first-class matches, including 65 for Middlesex (1947-62), taking 128 wickets at 32.87. He made a favourable impression in his first season when as a seventeen year old he finished second in the Middlesex bowling averages with 25 wickets at 19.36. He failed to maintain this form, however, and left County Cricket during the 1950 season. Recalled by Middlesex in 1961 as captain he led the side for two seasons. He collapsed whilst batting in a club match at Buckhurst Hill in 1966 and died on the way to the hospital.*




Walker's of Scarborough was a photographic studio which took many photographs at cricket matches in Scarborough from the 1920s to the 1960s. They took team groups, individuals and pairs, and would then sell the finished product at the matches. Some were produced with postcard backs, but many were also produced which were identical to postcards in size and quality, but without a postcard back. Most of these have a Walker's stamp on the back (the name appearing as either Walker, Walkers, Walker's or Walkers'), but some do not. Either way they are good quality, easily identifiable and very collectable. Nobody knows how many cricket postcards or photographs they produced, but it is certainly well over 1,000.



### Godfrey Phillips Cabinet-sized cards

Between 1923 and 1925, Godfrey Phillips issued a series of cards depicting 225 cricketers of the day. The cards were issued in five different formats, comprising two basic series: (1) 'Pinnacle' Series and (2) 'Brown Backs.' The 'Pinnacle' series is subdivided into (i) miniature cards, (ii) large cards and (iii) cabinet cards. The 'Brown Backs' are subdivided into (i) standard size and (ii) large size. Most of the formats consist of selected subjects from the series only, with Hon. F.S.G. Calthorpe the only player known to have been issued in each of the five different formats.

The cabinet-sized 'Pinnacle' sub-set comprises 181 known cards. They are c6 x 4 inches (c155 x 100 mm) real photographs, with plain backs.

Although they carry the series numbering on the front the cards are not inscribed with either 'Godfrey Phillips' or the 'Pinnacle' brand and so appear anonymous. A cabinet-sized card could be acquired from the issuer in exchange for 25 "perfectly clean Pinnacle Cigarette photos."



*James Seymour (1879-1930) played 553 matches, including 536 for Kent (1902-1926), scoring 27,237 runs at 32.08, with 53 centuries. When Seymour was awarded a benefit match by Kent in 1920, little did he realise that the game would have important consequences for all county cricketers. The Inland Revenue used it as a test case in an attempt to define money raised by benefit matches or events as taxable income. The match had raised £939 but in 1923 the Revenue claimed that Seymour owed £3,752 in tax, including interest and penalties. Seymour appealed against the judgment and in 1927 the House of Lords ruled in his favour, meaning that sports professionals' benefits and testimonials, in certain circumstances, remained tax free. Under new rules brought in by the Government in April 2017, benefit events are now subject to Income Tax in the UK.*



## Wisden's Cricketers' Almanack

Wisden first appeared in 1864 and until 1937 was primarily published in paper wrappers. The wrappers vary in colour - salmon pink, buff, and yellow have been used – and many of them have faded. From 1896 to 1937 a small proportion were also published in hardback. In 1938 limp cloth covers were introduced, featuring the famous woodcut of two Victorian cricketers by Eric Ravilious, as well as a new style of hardback. After the war a larger proportion were published in hardback. Dustjackets (featuring the Ravilious woodcut) have been supplied with hardbacks since 1965, although the woodcut gave way to a photographic portrait of a contemporary cricketer in 2003.

Since 1995 a limited edition leather-bound Wisden has also been published (100 numbered copies in 1995 and 150 numbered copies in subsequent years). In 2006, a special limited edition large format Wisden was introduced. Facsimile reprints of many years have also been issued.

From 1998 to 2005-06 an Australian version of Wisden was also published, both as an ordinary edition and as a limited edition (100 numbered copies).

Paper wrappers used before 1938 do not often survive in good condition. Wisdens were often rebound by their owners, or sometimes retailers, in a variety of coloured bindings. If they reach us in this state we sell them as they are. If they reach us in a disbound state lacking covers and/or advertisement pages, we either sell them disbound to those who wish to rebind in their own style or we have them rebound in a basic brown cloth.


This list contains multiple copies of Wisden for many years, with differing prices dependent on condition. A copy rebound without wrappers will be cheaper than a copy in original wrappers in very good state, but will still contain all the required information.
