April 2024

Another season of cricket has started, with two sweaters and an umbrella advisable in the April weather. I still have hopes of Somerset finishing on the top of the pile, but I have been hoping for that since I saw my first Somerset match in 1960, as one of a bus full of small boys in shorts taken to see the touring team at Taunton. That would have been South Africa, but I remember none of the match, just the excitement of being in the county ground watching my heroes.

This catalogue has the same mixture as usual, with 95% being newly acquired stock.

In the book section there are several of Richard Walsh's limited editions (Items 30, 35, 41 and 105). Bodyline is well covered, with a good run of *The Australian Cricketer* (Items 155 and 156), and some of the rarer Bodyline pamphlets, such as *A Sixer!* (Item 202) and one on Cricket Casualties (Item 205). Other rare tour books include Lord Hawke's Team in South Africa 1898-99 (Item 181), "*The Eventoscope*" *Cricket Souvenir* of 1907 (Item 185), and *All-India Cricketers' Tour 1932* (Item 201).

The autograph section has some nice sheets, including M.C.C. teams to Australia 1928/29 (Item 328), and 1932/33 - signed on a theatre programme (Item 329). There are some interesting oddities, with my favourite perhaps being the last listed (Item 509) - a postcard sent to Yorkshire members asking if they would be prepared to have a professional captain. In 1927, this was a revolutionary notion, and there was not to be a full-time professional county captain until after World War II.

For the next twelve months I will be writing a regular piece in *Wisden Cricket Monthly*, called "Collector's Corner", highlighting some of the interesting items I have come across in forty years of dealing with cricket books and memorabilia. It accompanies a major series of articles by David Woodhouse, titled "The Story of Cricket in 50 Books." This started in issue 74, with an amusing piece on Poet laureates and Nobel laureates. Most people know that Samuel Beckett is the only Nobel Laureate to play first-class cricket, and that Harold Pinter was obsessed with cricket, but Woodhouse brings out other flimsier connections, for example that Doris Lessing was reportedly chatted up and propositioned by Wally Hammond.

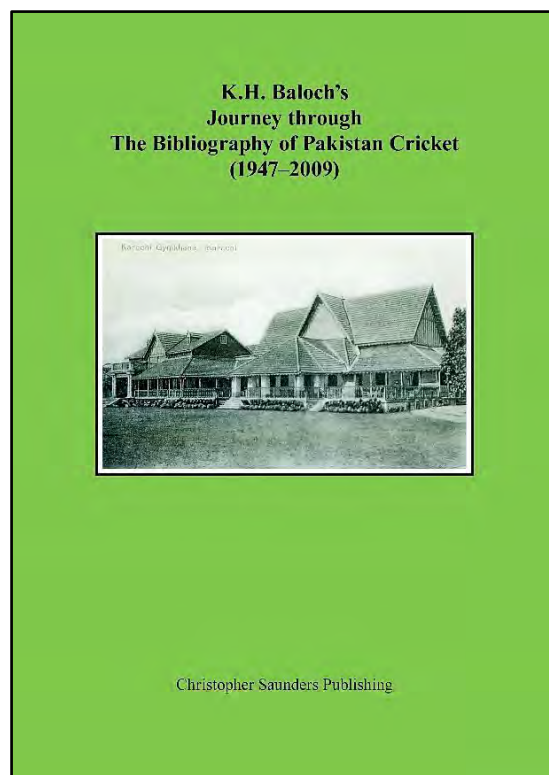
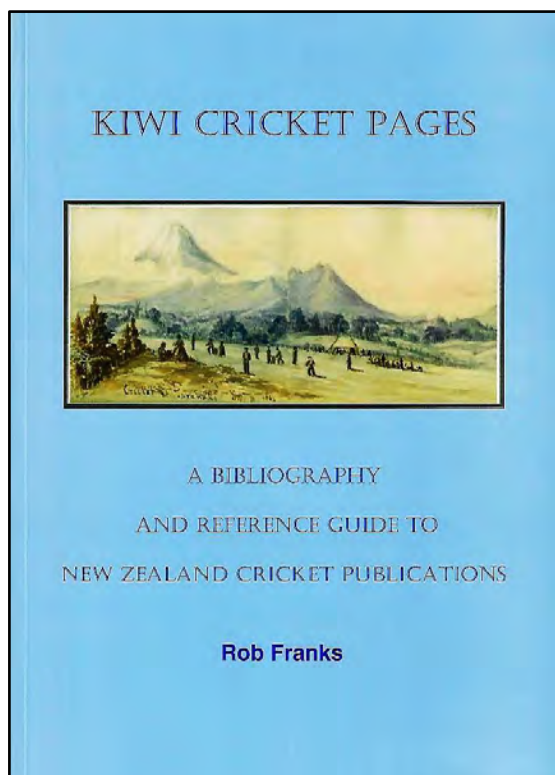

We give bibliographical references where we can, such as Padwick 4321. Padwick compiled the main bibliography of all cricket books and brochures, published in 1977, but we usually quote from the expanded second edition, published in 1984. This covers all cricket books published up to 1979. Volume II, by Ely and Griffiths, fills in a few gaps and lists all titles published between 1980 and 1989.

We also quote specialist bibliographies - “Franks” is the New Zealand Bibliography and “Baloch” is the Pakistan bibliography. We published both of these, and have copies available for sale at **£30 each or the two for £50 (post free in UK)**

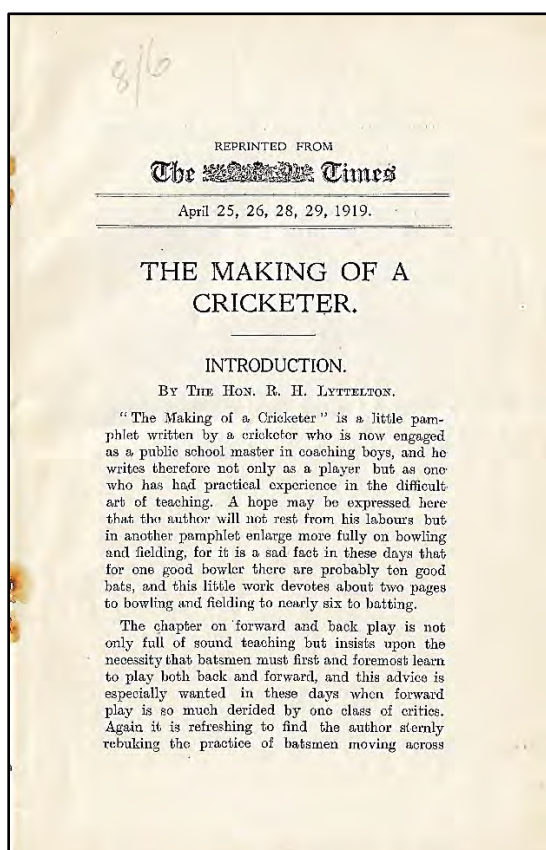

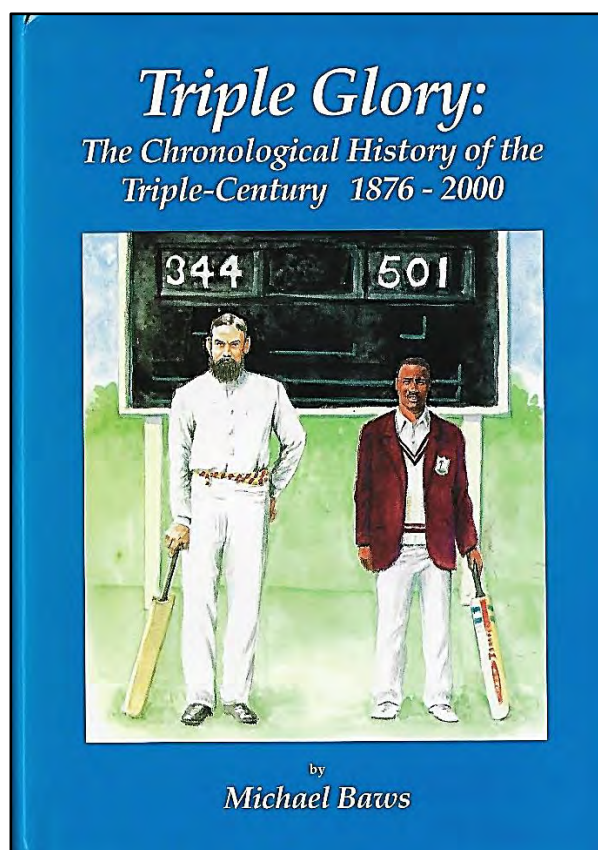

The articles deal with forward and back play, the importance of back play, bowling and fielding, and net practice.*

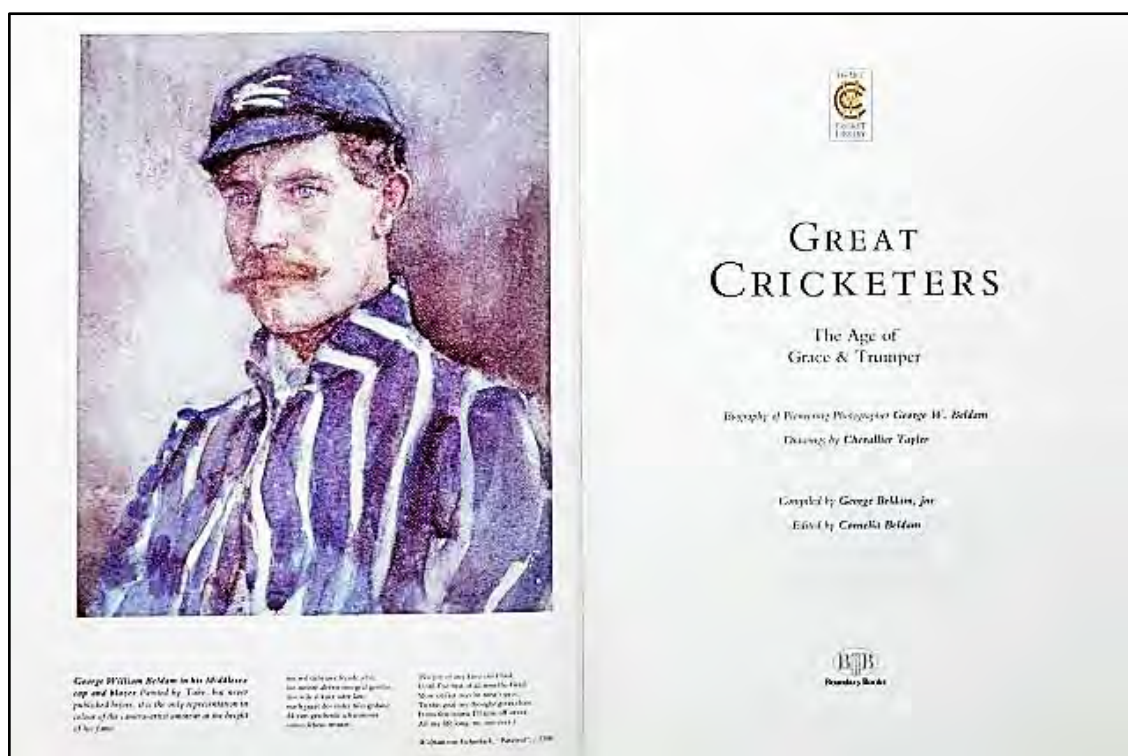
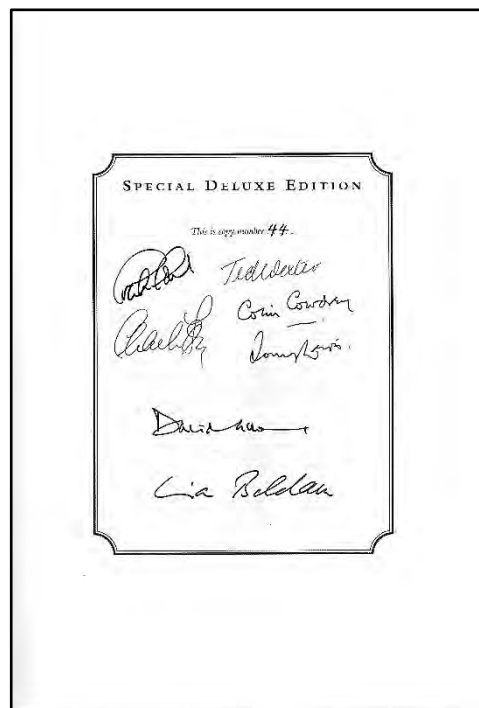

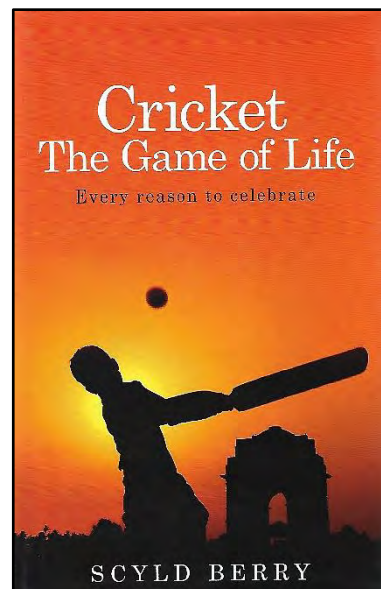

Inserted after the limitation leaf is a leaf signed by Graham Gooch, Ted Dexter, Charles Fry, Colin Cowdrey, Tony Lewis, David Gower and Cornelia Beldam, signing as Lia Beldam. Lia Beldam was the widow of George Beldam jnr, who did not live to see this book published.*

With the ownership signature of Robert Stratton Holmes, and the bookplate of B.J.Wakley (cricket collector and author of "Bradman the Great"). **£200.00**

*Padwick 6838. Bettesworth was entitled to call himself "An Old Sussex Cricketer" as he played 21 times for Sussex in the the 1870s and early 1880s, before moving to Scotland and later writing for cricket and other magazines. This is an amusing book, giving advice on what to do when playing or watching cricket. He dedicates the book to Lord Sheffield, benefactor of Sussex cricket. In his bibliography of cricket of 1937 Goldman calls it "very rare -- worth £2-£3".*

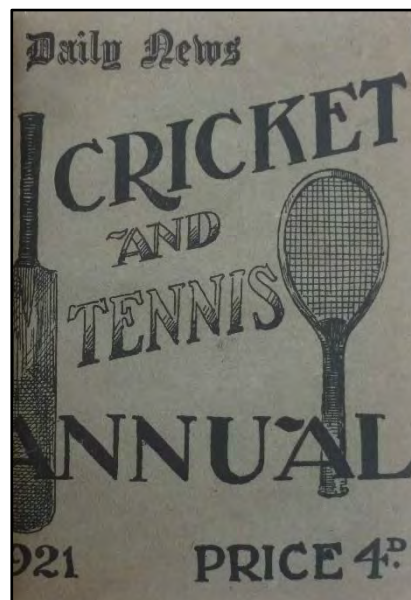

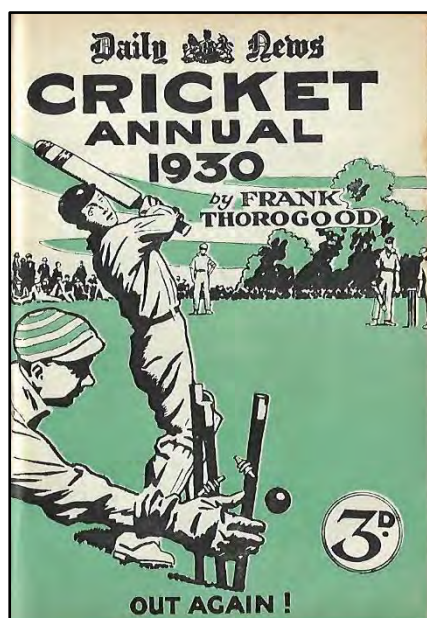
*Padwick 6968. Published in an edition of 150, of which 100 were for sale. The other 50 were for Sir Jeremiah Colman. It was published at £5.5.0., a remarkably luxurious production for wartime. The prospectus for the book stated that "The work has been in hand since pre-war days and neither effort nor expense have been spared to present the volume in a form worthy of the historical importance and artistic interest of the collection, ..... The publication of the work has been made possible by a generous subsidy provided by Sir Jeremiah Colman .... Each copy has cost more to produce than the figure at which it is now priced." It would be prohibitively expensive to produce such a volume now.*

*Padwick 1063. This annual has been known under a variety of names, reflecting various changes in publisher. It started life in 1895 as the 'Star and Morning Leader Cricket Manual' (Padwick 1114). From 1900 to 1908 it went under the title of 'Morning Leader Cricket Annual' (Padwick 1090); from 1909 to 1911 it was called 'Morning Leader Cricket and Sports Annual' (Padwick 1090); and from 1912 to 1914 'Daily News and Leader Cricket Annual' (Padwick 1065). There were no issues between 1915 and 1920, but from 1921*



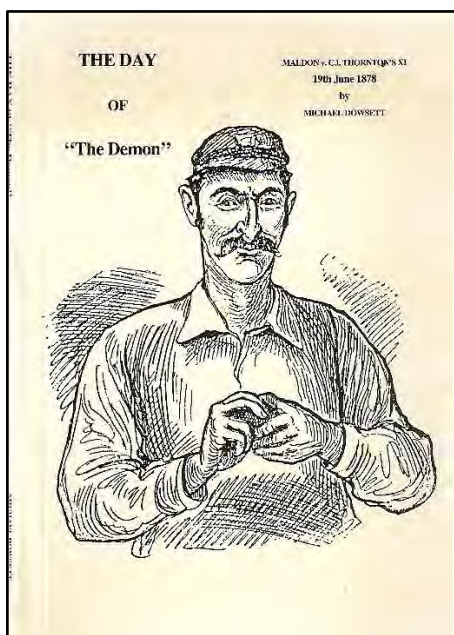
*to 1926 it was issued under the title of 'Daily News Cricket and Tennis Annual' (Padwick 1063). From 1927 to 1930 it was called 'Daily News Cricket Annual' (Padwick 1064), and from 1931 to 1939, and from 1946 to 1960 the 'News Chronicle Cricket Annual,' there being no issues from 1940 to 1945 (Padwick 1092). In 1961 and 1962, it changed title to 'The Cricket Annual' (Padwick 1040), before merging with the new, small style 'Playfair Cricket Annual' in 1963 (Padwick 1098).*

After a dispute with the Surrey committee in the middle of the 1909 season he moved to Australia to pursue a teaching career, and later represented South Australia. During the war he played a handful of matches for Otago and Wellington in New Zealand, before returning to England at the end of the war, and resuming his career with Surrey.*

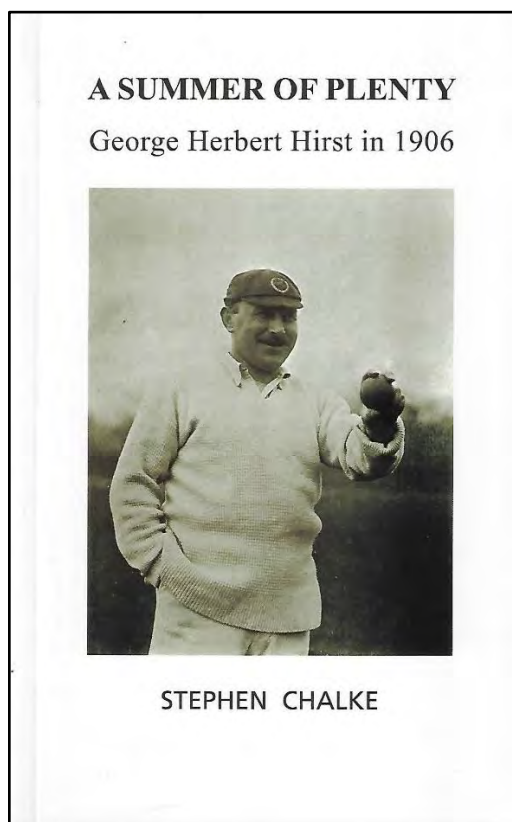


A photo of Neil Harvey as a schoolboy taken a short time prior to his famous match

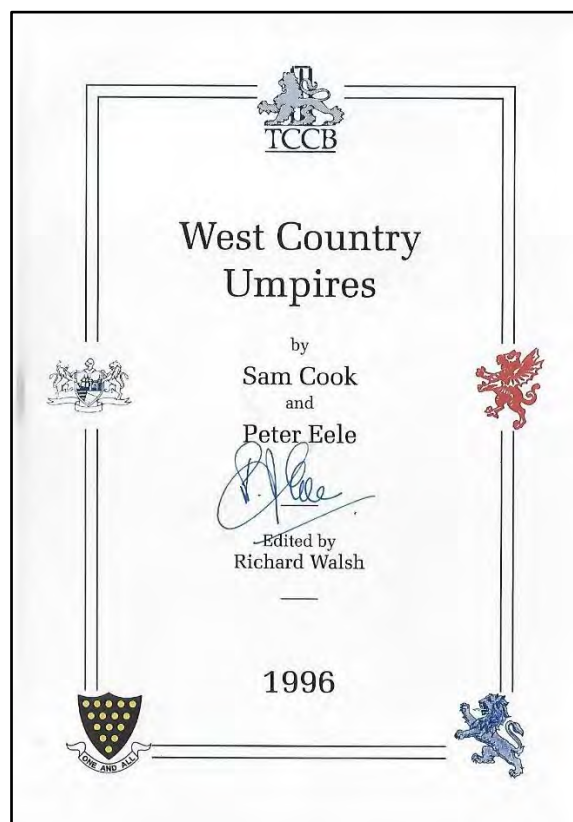

C.R.Bradish was a busy Australian journalist who worked with Sir Keith Murdoch, Rupert Murdoch's father.

George Brown (1887-1964) played 612 first class matches, mainly for Hampshire but with 7 Test matches. He was a true all-rounder, scoring 25,649 runs at 26.71, taking 626 wickets at 29.81 and claiming 646 victims behind the stumps. In this letter he is giving details of his career to a correspondent, and ends with a memory of a match: “I remember at Worcester before 1st World War J.Stone our regular keeper had his thumb badly injured. I was taken off bowling to keep. After a time Capt.E.M.Sprot decided to put me on to bowl. A.H.Bowell took over to keep, but in a few overs his thumb was put out of joint so I kept wicket for the rest of the match. I will remember this because Alex Bowell would not let me put the joint back although he had seen (me) slip my fingers also thumbs back in place. He would only let a doctor.”

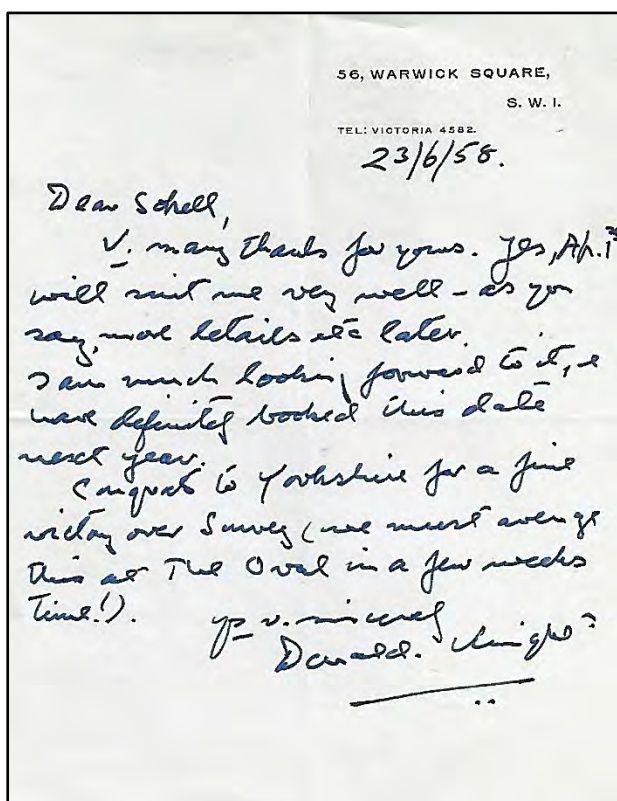
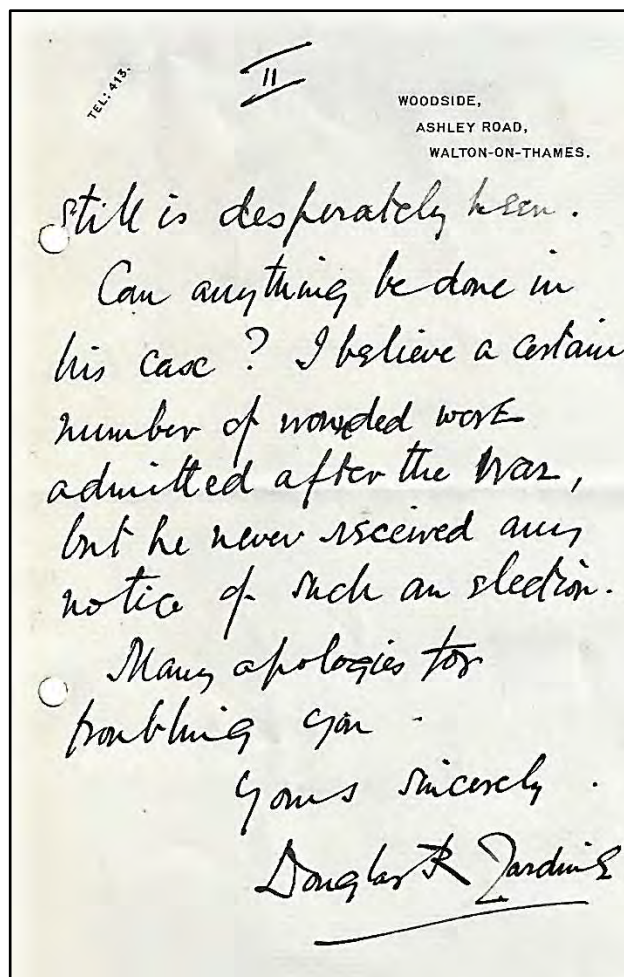

Ken Grieves (1925-1992) played 490 matches, including 10 for New South Wales (1945/46-1946/47) and 452 for Lancashire (1949-64), scoring 22,454 runs at 33.66, with 29 centuries, taking 242 wickets at 29.78 and dismissing 612 batsmen (608 caught, and 4 stumped). He played for Rawtenstall in the Lancashire League 1947-48. This is a short letter agreeing to speak to the Society, but warning that "I am not so hot when it comes to public speaking!"

Douglas Jardine (1900-1958) played for Oxford University (1920-23, blue 1920, 1921 and 1923), 141 matches for Surrey (1921-33) and in 22 Test matches for England (1928-1933/4). He captained England on the 1932/3 tour to Australia and employed the controversial leg-theory tactics which became known as 'Bodyline.' His captaincy caused much ill-feeling between England and Australia, but he proved successful, winning the series 4-1. In this letter he is asking for help: "During the summer I spoke to you about the case of a one legged ex sailor friend of mine, who wanted to become a member of the M.C.C. G.H.Carbutt by name." Jardine writes that Carbutt would have become a playing member if he had not lost his leg in the war, and asks "Can anything be done in his case? I believe a certain number of wounded were admitted after the war, but he never received any notice of such a selection."

Carte de Visite Photographs

Carte de visite photographs are so called because they are the size of a traditional visiting or calling card, about c2½ by 4 inches (c60 x 105 mm). They started in the 1850s as albumen photographs stuck on to thin card, and were very popular from the 1850s to the 1880s, when they were superseded by cabinet cards. The images are usually crisp and clear.

Five of the cards listed below are by Fradelle and Marshall. Albert Eugene Fradelle and William Shury Marshall had studios at 230 Regent Street (1872-76) and 246 Regent Street (1875-76) but in 1877 the partnership entered bankruptcy and was dissolved.

There are 11 cricketers in vignettes. From top left they are: George Bonnor, Eugene Palmer, Jack Blackham, Harry Boyle, Fred Spofforth, Billy Murdoch, Alick Bannerman, William Cooper, Percy M'Donnell, George Giffen and Henry Scott.

Andrew Greenwood (1847-1889) played 144 first-class matches, mainly for Yorkshire, but including two Test matches. Ted Peate (1855-1900) played 205 matches, including 9 Tests. There is no indication of photographer, but this looks to me like a Hurst of Sheffield photograph. The red borders are typical of his photographs. It did not appear on the front of an issue of "The All England Cricket and Football Journal and Athletic Review", published between April 1877 and October 1879 by Martin Hurst in Sheffield, but he advertised photographs of players for sale.

Edwin Stephenson (1832-1898) played 82 first-class matches, mainly for Yorkshire, scoring 1,940 runs at 14.80. As wicket-keeper he caught 56 and stumped 48. This is one of the earliest cricket photographs. There are earlier team photographs, but I do not know many other portraits of cricketers from the early 1860s. Stephenson played in London three times in 1861, once in 1862, and not at all in 1863.

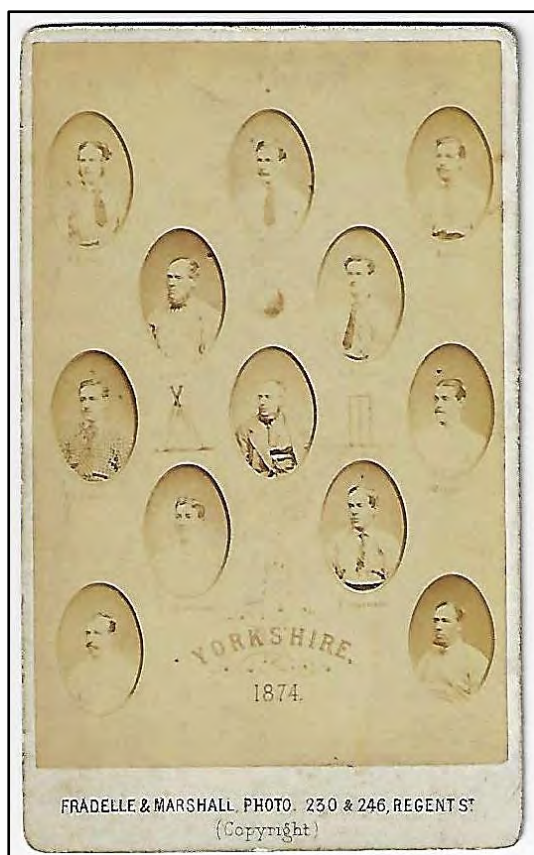

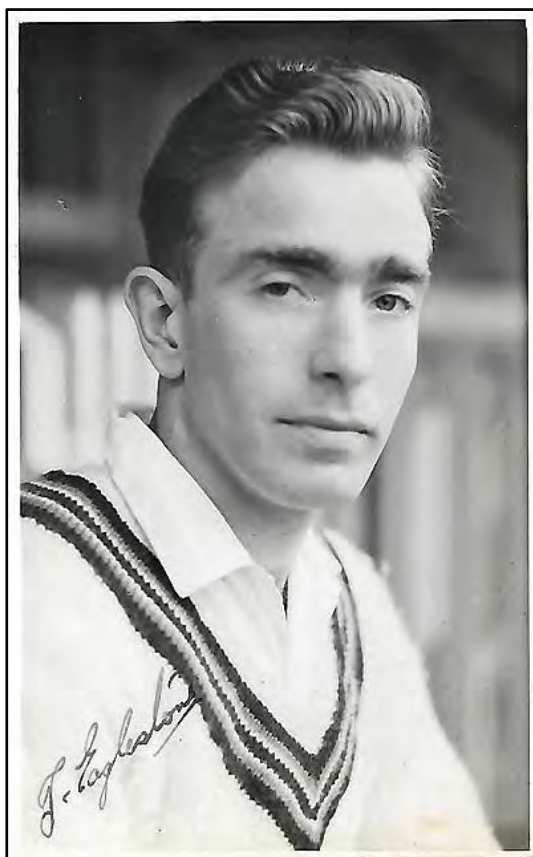
George Ulyett (1851-1898) played 359 matches for Yorkshire (1873-93) and made 25 Test appearances for England (1876/77 to 1890). In all he played 537 first-class matches, scoring just over 20,000 runs at 23.44 and taking 653 wickets at 20.14. He died of pneumonia contracted whilst watching Yorkshire play Kent at Bramall Lane and at the time of his death was regarded as the greatest batsman that Yorkshire had produced. I think this photograph was taken in August 1874, when Ulyett was part of the Yorkshire team that played Surrey at the Oval. The more usually seen photograph of Ulyett appeared on the front of issue no 14, Vol II (May 1878) of "The All England Cricket and Football Journal and Athletic Review", published between April 1877 and October 1879 by Martin Hurst in Sheffield. Each issue had a real photograph of a player or a team on the cover, and Hurst advertised in the magazine that copies of the photographs could be brought from him.

Records of Victorian photographers show Fradelle and Marshall with studios at 230 Regent Street (1872-76) and 246 Regent Street (1875-76). This card has both addresses on, but shows the Yorkshire team of 1874, the team, I think, which played Surrey at the Oval in August 1874: Thewlis, Smith, Lockwood, Greenwood A, Emmett, Ulyett, Clayton, Pinder, Ullathorne, Hill and Greenwood L. All are in cricket gear apart from Rowbotham, who was one of the umpires, and is shown in the centre in a suit, with waistcoat and watch chain. It may be that the photographs were taken in 1874, but not released and sold until 1875. I have seen individual carte de visite of nine of the team and Rowbotham, and all have both studio addresses.



Albert Wilkes & Son, West Bromwich

Started in 1910 by Albert Wilkes, the former Aston Villa and England footballer, this West Bromwich firm produced good quality cricket (and football) photographs and postcards up until the late 1960s.

The following are all postcard-sized photographs with plain backs (unless where stated) and stamped with the Wilkes name and address, and often the player's name and a date. These photographic cards are increasingly hard to acquire and highly desirable.

Jimmy Eaglestone (1923-2001) was a left-handed batter who played in 60 first-class matches - 1 for M.C.C. (1947), 9 for Middlesex (1947) and 50 for Glamorgan (1948-1949). He claimed Championship medals with both counties, even though he only scored 1,420 runs at an average of 15.77.

His was the uncle of Sunil Gavaskar.

'Jake' Seamer (1913-2006) was a right-handed batter who played in 91 first-class matches, including 21 for Oxford University (1934-36, blue all three years) and 59 for Somerset (1932-48), scoring 2,483 runs at 20.35. After completing his studies at Oxford, Seamer joined the Sudan Political Service. Although this limited his first-class cricket appearances to periods of leave, he was named as one of three amateurs to captain Somerset in 1948. He became a district commissioner in the Sudan, and after leaving the service, he taught at Marlborough College and was twice mayor of Marlborough.

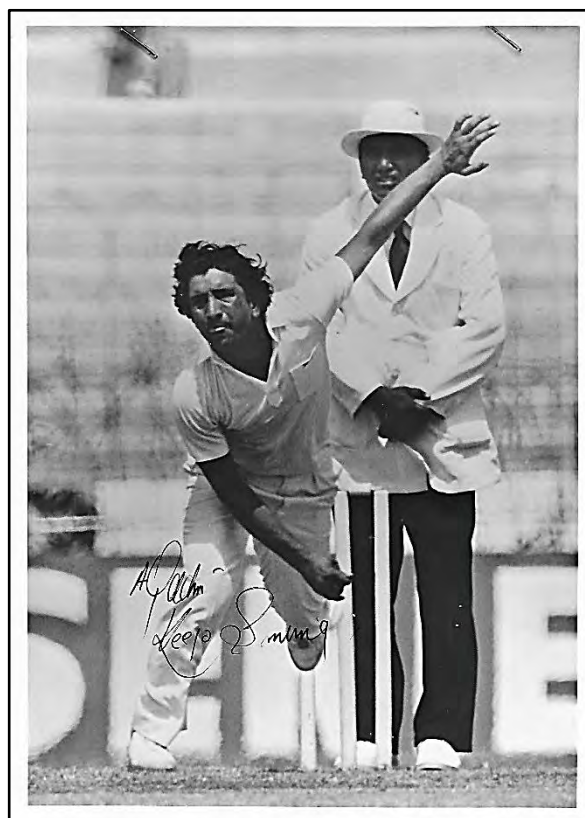

Abdul Qadir (1955-2019) was a leg-break and googly bowler who played 209 first-class matches, including 86 for Habib Bank Limited (1975/6-95/6) and 67 Tests for Pakistan (1977/8-90/91), taking 960 wickets at 23.24. He also played in 147 List A matches, including 104 One-Day Internationals, taking over 200 wickets.

This is the first full Australian touring team, only preceded by an aboriginal party in 1868. Eleven of them left Australia for the nine months away, joined by Midwinter in England, though he was only able to play a few matches before W.G. Grace “persuaded” him to leave the tourists and rejoin Gloucestershire, for whom he was qualified by birth in the Forest of Dean. This was on June 20th, so by the time this photograph was taken Midwinter was no longer in the touring party, and would not rejoin them. This photograph has all 11 remaining players, the Manager and the Assistant Manager, or as he is given on the photograph “agent in advance”. Standing (l-r): J. Conway (Manager - he played in five non first-class matches on the tour), G.H. Bailey, Mr Gibbs (agent in advance) and F.E. Allen; Seated (l-r): H.F. Boyle, W.L. Murdoch, T. Horan, D.W. Gregory, A. Bannerman and F.R. Spofforth; On ground (l-r); T.W. Garrett, C. Bannerman and J. Blackham. This match was not one of the Australian’s best, with Yorkshire winning by nine wickets. The publisher is given as W. Whitham of Bramall Lane Sheffield. Five years later Mr. W. Whittam. “the well-known score card printer, Bramall Lane, Sheffield”, started an annual which lasted for four years. It would seem to be the same person, which means he spelt his name wrongly on the photograph mount.

The photograph is blown up from one taken by A.&G. Taylor of Birmingham, which appears on the front page of the August 1878 issue of “The All England Cricket and Football Journal and Athletic Review”, published by Martin Hurst of Sheffield, which lasted from April 1877 to October 1879. As the photograph was taken by a Birmingham photographer it is most likely it was taken at the match between Birmingham and the Australians at Bournbrook Park in Birmingham from 24-26 June 1878. In the July 1878 issue Hurst had advertised cabinet cards and large photographs (c16 x 12 inches) of the Australian cricketers at 1 shilling each. I do not know who took the photographs or how many were sold, but I have never seen one.

The lunch was given to honour the Women's team and Bradman, who had just been knighted. The caption on the rear states that Eileen Whelan got the bat from Lindsay Hassett, in return for her hat, signed by the women's team. Eileen Ash (nee Whelan) died in 2021 at the age of 110.

Arthur Carr (1893-1963) played 468 matches, including 416 for Nottinghamshire (1910-34), and 11 Test matches for England (1922/3 to 1929), scoring 21,051 runs at 31.56. He captained Nottinghamshire from 1919 to 1934 and England in 6 Tests.

Attached to this photograph is a typed caption: "Photo is of A.W.Carr, of Notts County Cricket Club who after 15 years as captain of the County is reported to have resigned the captaincy and his Club membership (S & G. 28 September, 1934). (Cutting is from the 'News Chronicle' dated 29 Sept. 1934)." In the cutting, also attached, Carr denies the report. He tells the newspaper: "On each August 31 I automatically cease to be captain until re-elected in March of the following year. I have come to London to see a specialist about my heart (he'd suffered a heart attack earlier in the season). I have been pronounced perfectly fit to play cricket next season." In December 1934, it was announced that Carr would not captain Notts in 1935 and although Carr stated that he would play the following season if selected, he was not picked for any matches and thus his county career came to an end.

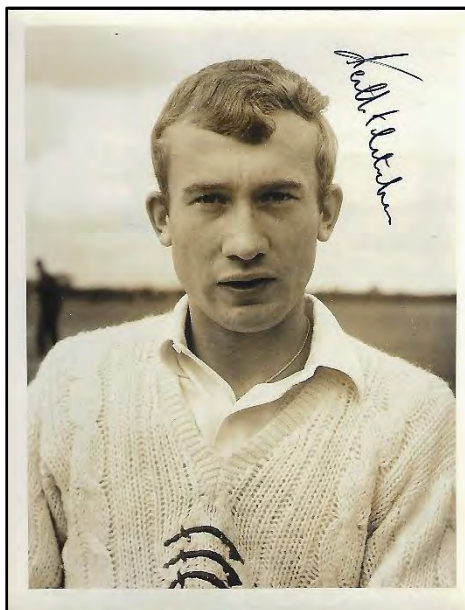

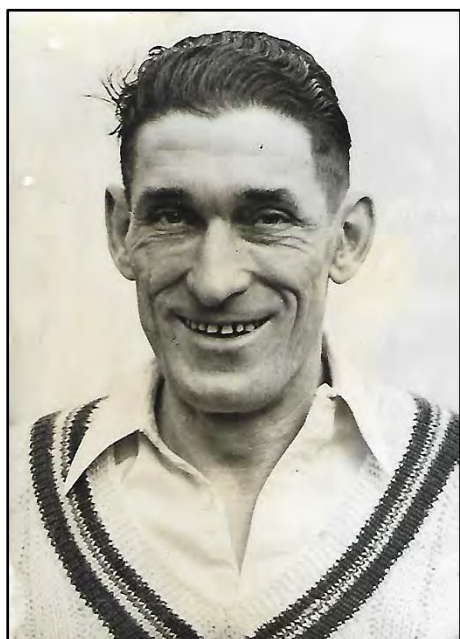

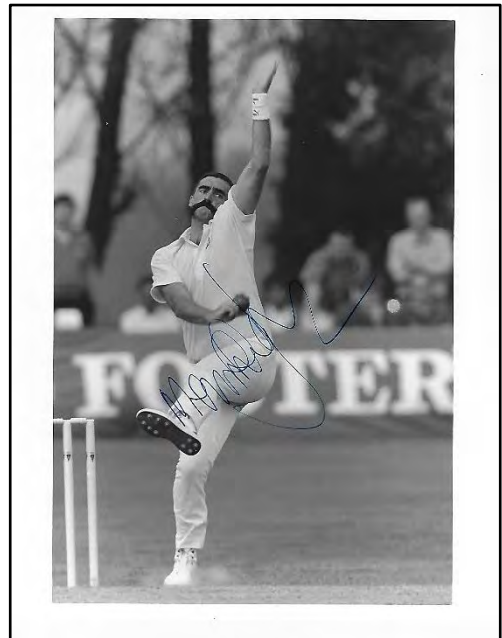
David Hookes (1955-2004) was an exciting and gifted left-handed batsman who was one of the game's more forceful and controversial characters. 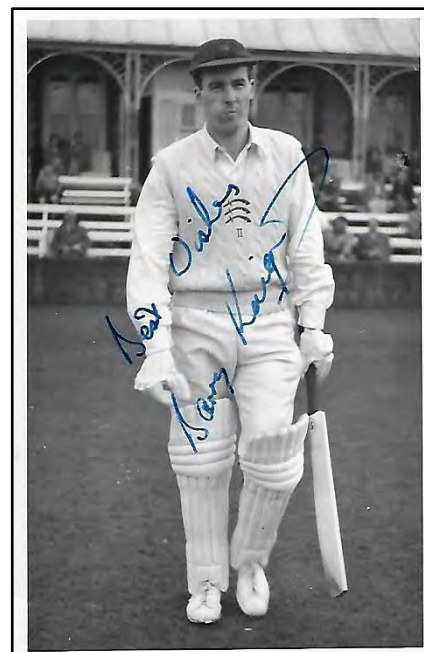

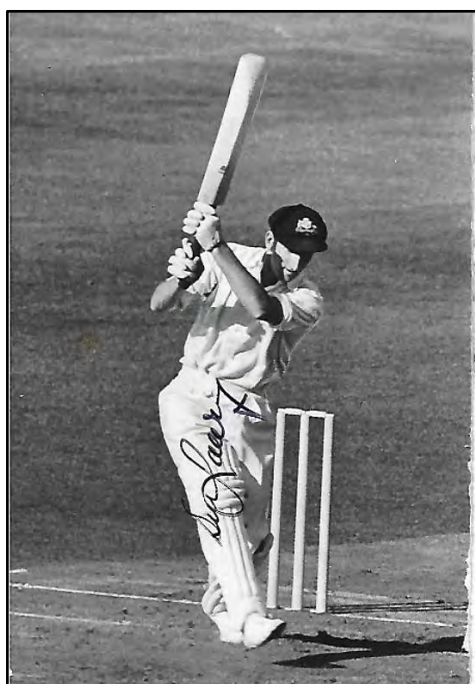

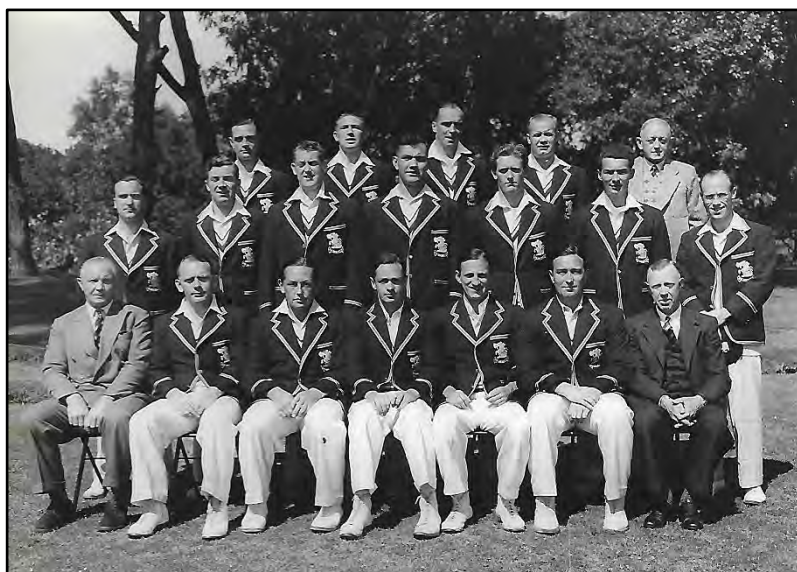

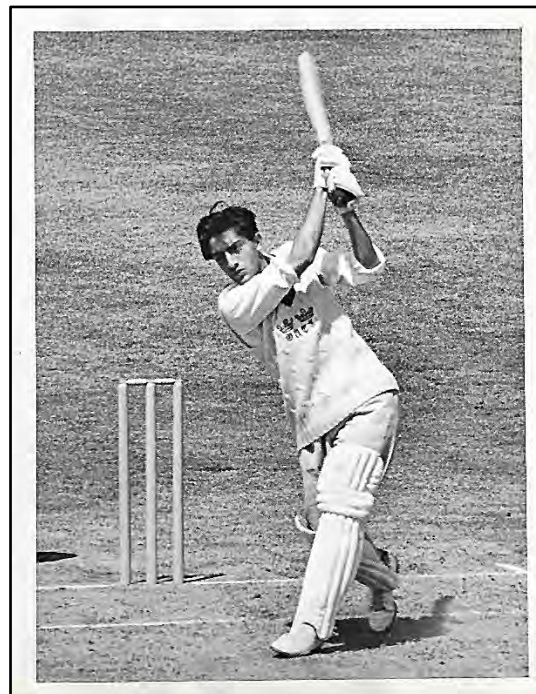

Peter Sainsbury (1934-2014) was a right-handed batter and slow left-arm orthodox bowler who played 618 first-class matches, including 593 for Hampshire (1954-76), scoring 20,176 runs at 26.86, taking 1,316 wickets at 24.14 and holding 617 catches. He also played in 165 List A matches, scoring more than 2,000 runs and taking over 200 wickets. After he retired he was the County’s coach from 1977-91.

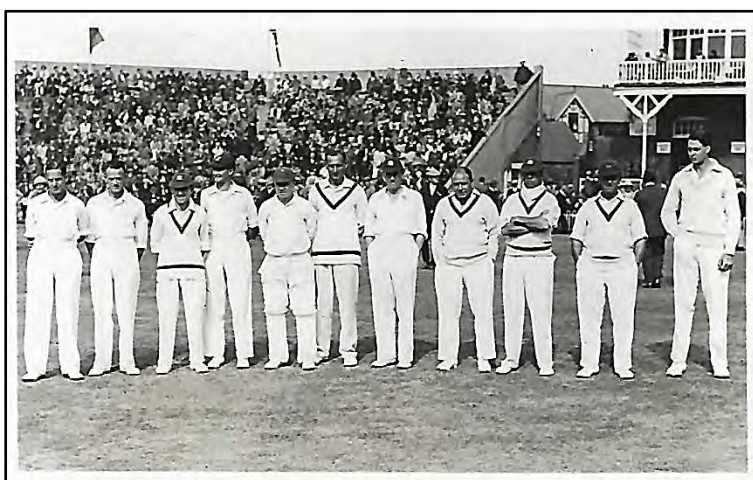
Walker's of Scarborough was a photographic studio which took many photographs at cricket matches in Scarborough from the 1920s to the 1960s. They took team groups, individuals and pairs, and would then sell the finished product at the matches. Some were produced with postcard backs, but many were also produced which were identical to postcards in size and quality, but without a postcard back. Most of these have a Walker's stamp on the back (the name appearing as either Walker, Walkers, Walker's or Walkers'), but some do not. Either way they are good quality, easily identifiable and very collectable. Nobody knows how many cricket postcards or photographs they produced, but it is certainly well over 1,000.

Godfrey Phillips Cabinet-sized cards

Between 1923 and 1925, Godfrey Phillips issued a series of cards depicting 225 cricketers of the day. The cards were issued in five different formats, comprising two basic series: (1) 'Pinnacle' Series and (2) 'Brown Backs.' The 'Pinnacle' series is subdivided into (i) miniature cards, (ii) large cards and (iii) cabinet cards. The 'Brown Backs' are subdivided into (i) standard size and (ii) large size. Most of the formats consist of selected subjects from the series only, with Hon. F.S.G. Calthorpe the only player known to have been issued in each of the five different formats.

The cabinet-sized 'Pinnacle' sub-set comprises 181 known cards. They are c6 x 4 inches (c155 x 100 mm) real photographs, with plain backs. Although they carry the series numbering on the front the cards are not inscribed with either 'Godfrey Phillips' or the 'Pinnacle' brand and so appear anonymous. A cabinet-sized card could be acquired from the issuer in exchange for 25 "perfectly clean Pinnacle Cigarette photos."

Bill Ashdown (1898-1979) played 487 matches, including 482 for Kent (1920-37), scoring 22,589 runs at 30.73 and taking 602 wickets at 32.47. He is the only cricketer to appear in first-class matches in England both before the First World War and after the Second, having made his debut (aged 15) for G.J.V.Weigall's Team against Oxford in 1914 and playing his final first-class match for M.Leyland's XI at Harrogate in 1947.

Douglas (1882-1930) played 651 first-class matches, including 459 for Essex (1901-28) and 23 Tests for England, scoring more than 24,000 runs (at an average of just under 28) and taking nearly 1,900 wickets (at around 23 each). He was captain of Essex from 1911 to 1928 and led England on two tours to Australia - in 1911/12, when he had the captaincy thrust upon him by Warner's illness, and in 1920/21. He also captained the MCC to South Africa in 1913/14. In all he led England in 18 Tests. In his spare time he won a gold medal for boxing at the 1908 Olympics and played amateur football to international level. He died whilst attempting to save his father when the ship in which they were travelling was in collision with another in dense fog.

In 1927 the Yorkshire Committee could not find a suitable amateur to captain the side in 1928, and by a small majority the committee, meeting in November 1927, decided to offer Herbert Sutcliffe the captaincy. He would have been the first professional captain of the modern era. Sutcliffe was at the time with the M.C.C. side on the ship to South Africa. Before he had given his answer to the committee a group of members who felt Rhodes had a better claim to the captaincy conducted a ballot of members by post. This is one of the postcards sent to members of the Yorkshire club in December 1927. The card has two questions to be answered: 1. Are you in favour of the appointment of an Amateur or a Profesional? 2. If it is not possible to secure a suitable amateur, whom are you in favour of - Wilfred Rhodes or Herbert Sutcliffe? The result of the ballot was a large majority for an amateur captain, and if there was to be a professional captain Rhodes was the favourite. In the event Sutcliffe declined the offer of the Captaincy, and the Committee, with a sigh of relief, asked Sir William Worsley to captain Yorkshire in 1928.



Wisden's Cricketers' Almanack

Wisden first appeared in 1864 and until 1937 was primarily published in paper wrappers. The wrappers vary in colour - salmon pink, buff, and yellow have been used – and many of them have faded. From 1896 to 1937 a small proportion were also published in hardback. In 1938 limp cloth covers were introduced, featuring the famous woodcut of two Victorian cricketers by Eric Ravilious, as well as a new style of hardback. After the war a larger proportion were published in hardback. Dustjackets (featuring the Ravilious woodcut) have been supplied with hardbacks since 1965, although the woodcut gave way to a photographic portrait of a contemporary cricketer in 2003.

Since 1995 a limited edition leather-bound Wisden has also been published (100 numbered copies in 1995 and 150 numbered copies in subsequent years). In 2006, a special limited edition large format Wisden was introduced. Facsimile reprints of many years have also been issued.

From 1998 to 2005-06 an Australian version of Wisden was also published, both as an ordinary edition and as a limited edition (100 numbered copies).

Paper wrappers used before 1938 do not often survive in good condition. Wisdens were often rebound by their owners, or sometimes retailers, in a variety of coloured bindings. If they reach us in this state we sell them as they are. If they reach us in a disbound state lacking covers and/or advertisement pages, we either sell them disbound to those who wish to rebind in their own style or we have them rebound in a basic brown cloth.

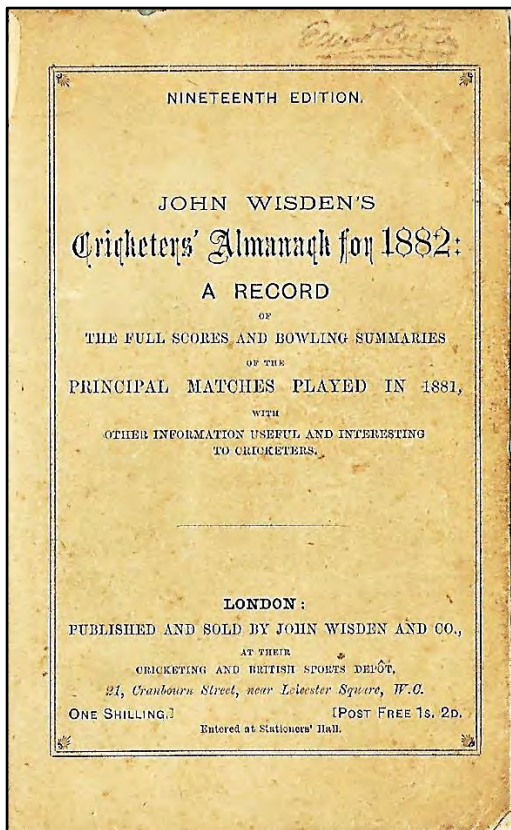
This list contains multiple copies of Wisden for many years, with differing prices dependent on condition. A copy rebound without wrappers will be cheaper than a copy in original wrappers in very good state, but will still contain all the required information.
